

SUNDAY & MONDAY

All vehicle access to the Showgrounds will be through the gate located near table tennis on Kilmarnock Terrace, with vehicles being able to park around the eastern side of the show grounds.

At the conclusion of the fireworks display on Sunday evening vehicles will be able to leave the grounds via the Cattle Gate (SW of Showgrounds) onto South Tce.

Motor vehicles of members of the Society and of nonmembers will be parked on the eastern side of show grounds, entry via the Table Tennis gates, under the direction of stewards, as far as space available there will permit.

RECIPES

Apple Cake Recipe

190gms (1-1/4 cups) SR Flour, 90gms (30zs) sugar, 60gms (20z) butter, 500gms (1lb) well drained stewed apples, 1 egg, small quantity of milk to make a stiff dough. Rub butter into sifted flour, add sugar, add beaten egg and lastly milk. Roll out to fit approx. 20 cm round sandwich tin (mixture top and bottom, apple in centre). Bake 30-40 minutes, ice with lemon flavoured icing.

Chickpea Brownie Slice Recipe

400gm tin chickpeas, drained and rinsed, 1/2 cup brown >15 YEARS & UNDER sugar, 1/2 teaspoon baking powder, 1/3 cup chopped pecan nuts, 2 eggs, 2 tspns vanilla essence, 1/4 cup dark chocolate bits.

Grease a 28 x 18cm slice tin and line with baking paper. Blend chickpeas in food processor, add sugar, eggs, essence and baking powder and blend until all ingredients are combined, stir in choc bits and pecan nuts. Pour mixture into prepared tin and bake for 20-25 mins at 160 degrees fan forced. Cool in tin then cut into squares.

Six Rock buns

Recipe: 125gms fat reduced margarine, 250gms SR Flour, 1 heaped tblspn granulated sweetener, 1 cup sultana's and currants, 1 egg beaten, grated rind and juice of 1 lemon, 1 tblspn water approx. If preferred instead of lemon juice, use all water. Rub margarine into flour, add all the other ingredients and mix. Place large teaspoons of mixture on greased oven tray and bake in moderate oven for approx 15 minutes.

Pineapple Fruit Cake

500gms mixed dried fruit, 1/4 cup orange juice, 125gms > 8 YEARS & UNDER butter, 1 tspn mixed spice,1 cup finely chopped dried apricots, 440gms undrained tin unsweetened crushed pineapple. Boil all the ingredients for 5 minutes, then let cool. Stir in 2 lightly beaten egg whites, 1 tspn carb soda and 2 cups SR Flour. Bake in prepared approx 20 cm square tin for 1 and 1/2 hours.

Sultana loaf

Recipe: 1 cup water, 60gms margarine, 240gms SR Flour,1 egg, 1 cup sultanas, 1 tspn carb soda, 1 tspn mixed spice, 1 tblspn granulated sweetener. Place sultanas, water, sweetener, margarine and carb soda in a saucepan, bring to the boil and simmer for 3 minutes. Allow to cool. Stir in beaten egg, sifted SR Flour and spice, pour into greased loaf tin and bake in moderate oven for approx 35-40 mins.

Six Oat and Sultana Biscuits

Recipe: 1/2 cup margarine, 1 heaped tblspn granulated sweetener, 1 egg, few drops of vanilla essence, 2/3 cup

sultanas, 1 cup SR Flour, rolled oats for rolling. Cream margarine, sweetener and vanilla together, add egg, flour and sultanas. Divide into 8 pieces, roll between hands, drop into rolled oats to be coated lightly all over. Place on greased tray and press lightly with fingers to about half height, cook in moderate oven approx 15-20 mins.





REGULATIONS

- I. A subscription of \$30 annually to the funds of the Society is the necessary qualification for membership. All members who have paid their subscription for the previous year and any new members who have paid their subscriptions of the current year shall be entitled to one voice and vote in the proceedings of the Society and to all such rights and privileges to which members are entitled.
- Members who have paid a subscription of \$45 for the year are entitled to: Members Ticket, 2 Adult and 3 Children's Tickets, Free Car Parking plus, Free entries for exhibits in Stacey Pavilion at the Annual Show, Two Children's Tickets transferrable for one Adult Members Ticket
- Members who have paid \$30 for the year are entitled to: 1 Members Ticket, 2 Adult Ticket, Free Car Parking
- Non-members can exhibit in any class for competition at the Annual Show, under the prescribed conditions, on payment of the entry fees prescribed for each section.
- 5. Prices of admission to Showground on day of Show will be: Members and Subscribers on presentation of tickets (wristbands,) Adults non-members: \$16, Children under 16 years of age: \$8, Pre-school children: Free, Motor cars vehicles: \$2 Members' cars and vehicles will be admitted free on presentation of vehicle ticket.
- 6. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor, and in Sections A B E F G K L M N O P Q R S T U V W X, and where specified in Sections G and I, must have been grown, made, produced or bred by the exhibitor as the case may be.
- 7. The judges are empowered to decide the age of any animal exhibited at the Shows of the Society.
- 8. The judges are empowered to withhold prizes in any class or classes wherein the quality of the exhibits does not, in their opinion, merit an award; they may award a second prize in lieu of a first or a third in lieu of a second prize and need give no reasons for the withholding or substitution of such prize or prizes.
- 9. Any misstatement or misrepresentation made in any pedigree certificate handed in with any entry of an exhibit or in entering an exhibit or exhibits in classes where the expressed conditions are not complied with shall render such exhibit or exhibits liable to disqualification and the prize or prizes (if any) liable to forfeiture. Any exhibitor or person interfering in any way with or making use of insulting words to the judge or judges, steward or stewards shall render their exhibit or exhibits liable to disqualification and any prize or prizes liable to forfeiture and may render themselves liable to disqualification as exhibitors at the Shows of the Society and to have their names expunged from the roll of members of the Society.
- (Vide sub-section [d] of No. 7 of the Rules and Constitution of the Society.)
- 11. No person shall act as a judge in any class in which he or she is an exhibitor, or in which he or she has a material interest.
- In Sections L and M, any exhibit in any class, after having taken a first prize, is thereby debarred from competition in any other class in those sections.
- 13. Entries for all exhibits for the Show are received by the Secretary of the Society or his/her staff subject to the approval of the Executive Committee, who may decline to accept such entry without assigning any reason for doing so, and entries for exhibits in all classes are received by the Society only on the express condition that the exhibitor agrees to abide by the decision of the judges, stewards and executive committee, and that the decisions and awards made are given as final and not subject to any actions at law.
- 14. Protests against awards must be lodged, in writing, at the office of the Secretary within one hour of the time from which such awards have been made known to the public, and the grounds of protest must be stated. Protests must be accompanied by a deposit of a sum equal to half the amount of the prize awarded with which the protest is concerned, and if the protest is not upheld or if it is considered frivolous, the deposit may be forfeited.
- Protests will be considered, and a decision given by the Executive Committee of the Society.
- 16. The Society reserves the right to sell or lease any concessions, subject to sundry agreements already completed, for the rights to carry on business, entertainments or other undertakings on its showground on the days of its Annual Shows and will grant such rights and such space as is deemed desirable by the Executive Committee under the conditions set out on the application form and schedule prepared for that purpose.
- 17. Demonstration motorcars and motorcycles and/or goods or machines of a similar nature, on the application of bona-fide distributors, will be allotted space suitably located on the show grounds. In the event

- of bookings exceeding the space available, the Conveners will allot space in proportion to the ratio of bookings. Machinery Sites: $6m \times 12m \$100$ for car dealers. Machinery block $20m \times 20m \$200$
- 18. All horses, cattle and sheep must not be removed until 4 pm unless otherwise provided, as set out in sectional headings. All other exhibits must not be removed until 3.30 pm. For any infringement of this rule, the prize, if any, may be forfeited.
- 19. Owners of entire horses must have a person in charge of such entire. All horse stock to keep in ground allotted only.
- 20. All prize winners in horse and cattle classes must parade their stock, failing to do so they may be liable to have their prize or prizes in that Section absolutely forfeited.
- 21. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserves the right of refusing admittance to or removing same from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
- 22. Winners of cups or trophies, which must be won more than once in order to become the absolute property of final winner, may obtain possession of said cup or trophy for the year following date of Show at which they have been awarded same, on condition that they give to the Secretary of the Society an undertaking to return said cup or trophy to the Society in good order and condition not later than three weeks before the date of the Show next, following the one at which they were awarded the cup or trophy.
- The Society recognizes Yates Garden Guide as the standard work of reference regarding exhibits in Section M.
- 24. Any conditions or regulations printed in the prize list under the various Section headings are to be construed as part of the regulations governing the conduct of the Show of the Society and equally binding on exhibitors.
- 25. All sideshow personnel must have pegs of tents, etc., adequately concealed to protect the public.
- 26. All persons entering the grounds or premises on which the Jamestown Agricultural, Horticultural and Floricultural Society Inc. Show is conducted, whether as spectators, competitors or otherwise, do so at their own risk, and the Society is unable to hold itself responsible for damage or loss which may be suffered by any person so entering, whether caused by an act or omission (negligent or otherwise) of the Society or any of its servants, agents or employees. No responsibility shall rest on and no liability shall be incurred by The Society in respect to any event connected with the Show. The Society will not under any circumstances hold itself liable for any accident on the grounds or premises.
- Drivers of any vehicles will be admitted only on presentation of admission of members tickets or admission fees.
- 28. The Society does not permit goods or badges to be sold by hawking unless permission is granted.
- 29. The pavilion will be closed to all exhibitors at 10:00 am Sunday. (This will be strictly adhered to.) All Conveners and stewards shall remain in the Pavilion. Exhibits arriving after the above stated times may, by permission of the Executive Committee, be exhibited, but will be excluded from competition.
- 30. Cash payouts of prize money can be collected from the Show Office Monday October 7 between 10:00am to 4:30pm or at the Secretary's Office on Tuesday following the show between 9 am and 12 noon. Prize money and trophies will be paid by convenors in events held outside Stacey Pavillion. Prize money and trophies which have not been collected by 12 noon on the Tuesday following the show will be forfeited Refer to Page 9 PRIZE MONEY & TROPHIES
- 31. Any person or attendant giving annoyance to any Section Conveners, committee member or secretary shall be removed from the ground.
- 32. A first prize to count five points, second prize to count three points, third prize to count one point. Champion prizes do not count. In the event of a tie for highest points, the exhibitor who gains the most first prizes will be declared the winner.
- 33. Exhibitors must gain at least 15 points to win an aggregate trophy.
- 34. Entries in Stacey Pavilion must be in one name only. Entries may be in family names for sections L, M & N, but only one amount of prize money or trophy will be awarded.
- 35. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by The Society.
